In the future, would suggest allowing younger Scouts to attend if they participate in the shakedown. A critical part of the planning. As the week went along, a team attitude developed. Very good to see. Holes in duty roster were filled, and the meals were top-notch. Cooperation made the meals possible. Such a canoe trip is probably supportable biannually, but not annually.
- Deb W is coordinating September Court of Honor/Dinner. Deb proposed that guests contribute \$5.00 per person and be asked to contribute a dessert or salad. Troop will provide table coverings, paper products and beverages. (The committee approved \$50 expenditure towards those items.)
