March 2018 Outdoor Program Coordinators Report

With the new Scoutbook system would encourage all parents to "RSVP" for your Scout's participation – or not – in any particular event. The system will automatically generate a permission form for you to sign if you respond "yes."

March 2018: Backpacking (towards Merit Badge) March 23-25, 2018

Trip will be on a portion of the Appalachian Trail located in Maryland. Troop will camp at the Crampton Gap shelter located ½ mile north of Gathland State Park. No reservation allowed/required. Part of troop will hike from the Lambs Knoll Look Out Tower to the Edward Garvey Memorial Shelter, then to Crampton Gap, and then on to Harpers Ferry on Sunday. Part of the troop will work on Scout skills from the Crampton Gap shelter. Six Scouts and 2/3 adults from Troop 857 will be joining Troop 918.

April 2018: Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST) April 7

One night of camping at Cunningham Falls State Park in Thurmont. Park is approximately $1\,\%$ hours from Severna Park. Check in time 3:00 on Saturday, check out time 1:00 on Sunday. Rustic Cabin (Site 109) with 30 amps of electricity. Tent camping Site 107 are adjacent to each other on the Deer Spring Loop.

April 2018: Merit Badge Madness, April 14, 2018 –

One day trip, no camping. See Ed Knox for additional details.

April 2018: Biking/camping trip, April 27-April 29, 2018 --

Reservation has been made for the Shady Trail youth site at Milburn Landing at the Pocomoke River State Park.

May 2018: The Adventure Park at Sandy Spring Friends School, May 12, 2018 (Saturday)

Sandy Spring Rope course and camping. Typical visit is early climbing (10:30 a.m.), lasts for approximately 3 hours, have lunch, campground opens at 3:00 p.m. until 11:00 a.m. on Sunday. Cost is \$38.52 per climber (we are locked into the 2017 rates because of early booking). Made a \$150 non-refundable (although can reschedule) deposit.

June 2018: Singoquipe Boy Scout Camp, June 17-23, 2018

Payment schedule for youth camper is below, assuming payment by May 15. Adult camper fee is \$150 (same fee schedule).
